Because she wanted to ensure that women, especially Black women, who were doing great work could be recognized.

Her work in the community did not go unnoticed. In 2005 the Memphis Women's Magazine recognized her as one of "50 Women Who Make a Difference." She indeed made a difference in the lives of every child she supported and every woman she felt needed to be recognized.






